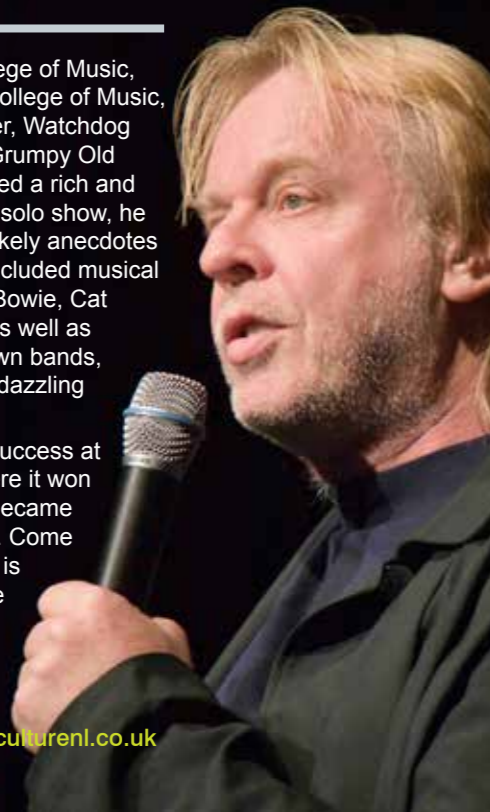


Rick Wakeman – The Music and Anecdotal Wit of an Old Age Pensioner

fame in the late 80's and early 90's coupled with relentless touring took its toll on Colin and he took a step back from the music industry, setting up his own label and working under his own name. The fans however were always with him and his albums were always met with critical acclaim and huge anticipation for a loyal fan base.

In 2014 Colin reverted back to using the name Black and also found a renewed passion for his craft. Colin joined forces with fellow musician Calum MacColl (Callum is the son of folk legend Ewan and brother of Kirsty), who is able to bring the best from him and has seen Colin pen his best material to date. The chemistry they share on stage is easy to see.

Towards the end of 2014 they headed to the studio with renowned Scottish producer Calum Malcolm (The Blue Nile) to record a new album, backed by a Pledge campaign from fans, and the album is scheduled to be released in March 2015. The voice is smoother and sweeter than ever, the songs as stirring and evocative as we remember and the live performance is taken to another level. The 'best voice of his generation' is back... better than ever.

Over 20 years have passed since Dire Straits disbanded, leaving in their wake a catalogue of some of the finest compositions and musical performances that the heyday of rock ever produced. If anything, their reputation has only grown with time. Record sales of more than one hundred and twenty million albums continue to increase as new young fans discover the music and join the band's massive worldwide following.

It was against the backdrop of this two-decade break - and an increasing demand to hear the songs played live again - that members of Dire Straits, Alan Clark, Chris White and Phil Palmer formed The Straits for a charity show at The Royal Albert Hall in 2011. Between them they have worked with an enviable list of rock royalty that includes (but is not limited to) David Gilmour, Eric Clapton, Paul McCartney, Elton John, David Bowie, Mick Jagger, Tina Turner, Van Morrison, Tom Jones and Sheryl Crow. And so it is that these songs, in all their ambition, grandeur and aching beauty, are once again presented live, for the fans that have kept them alive.

Sounding rejuvenated and more relevant than ever, Birmingham's reggae stars UB40 hit Motherwell Concert Hall in 2015.

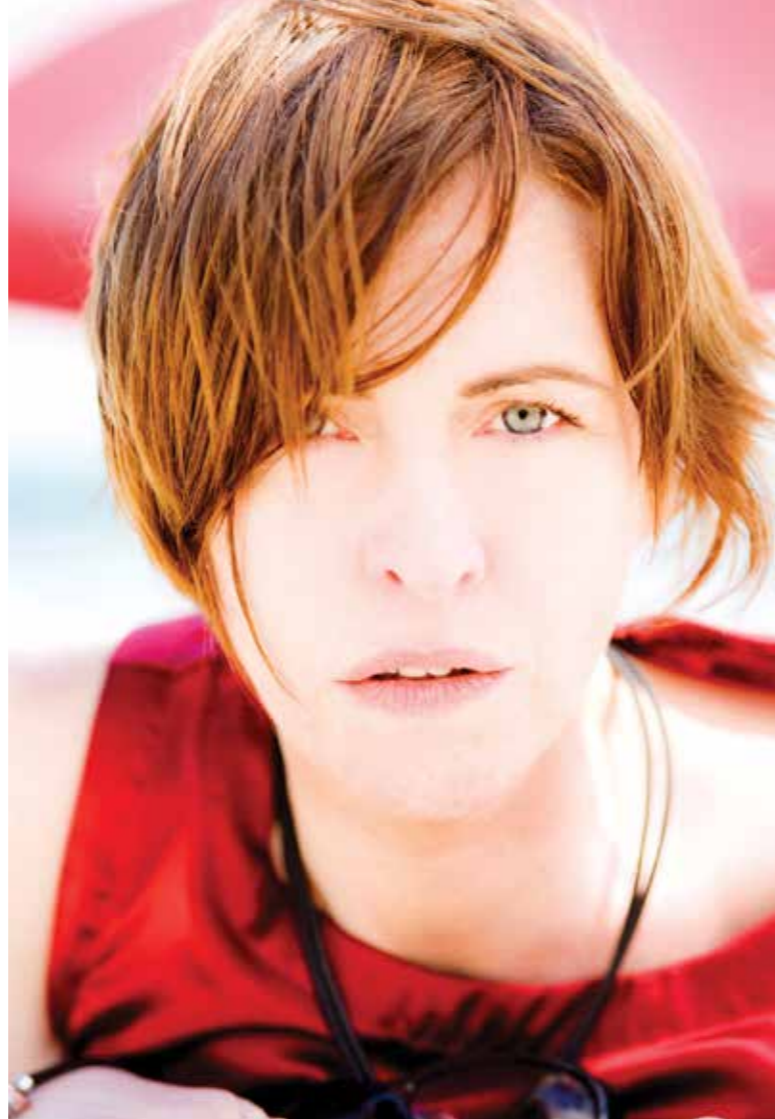

Ireland's internationally acclaimed singer-songwriter Eleanor McEvoy stops at Airdrie on her tour in support of her latest album *Stuff*, released on 12th May, 2014.

Exposed to music at a very early age, Dublin born Eleanor grew up in a strict Catholic household in the grey north-side suburb of Cabra. After a musical upbringing playing the piano, violin and performing on stage with her older siblings, Eleanor graduated in music from Trinity in Dublin and set out to pay her way through life as a jobbing musician. Already writing her own songs, she was waiting for the opportunity to branch out on her own. To initially pay her way, Eleanor spent four years in Ireland's National Symphony Orchestra (NSO), she recorded studio sessions as a singer, fiddle and keyboard player and joined Irish diva Mary Black's touring band. She then decided to cash in her savings and go for it; spending the cash on better song demos, home recording gear and a decent guitar.

An eleven-track miscellany, her new album tells tales of unrequited love, lust and eloquent farewell; a heady brew of caustic observation laced with wit and wry self-deprecation typical of multi-instrumentalist McEvoy, all delivered in the Irish star's rich, lilting voice.
