# **Lesson 1 - Sketchbook Making**

### **Description**

In this class we will be making a sketchbook. We will firstly be exploring collage and mark-making to make a sketchbook cover. You will then be shown some easy techniques for binding your sketchbook together. We will be using this sketchbook in the coming weeks for our warm-up exercises but you are free to use it in whichever way you wish!

#### You Will Need:

- Ruler
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Glue
- Needle
- Thread/Yarn/String
- Old paintbrush
- Water
- Ink or Paint (or both!)
- Found materials (packing paper, cardboard, bubble wrap, bottle caps, tissue paper)

# **Artist Inspiration:**



Henri Matisse - Paper Cut-Outs



## Steps:

- 1. Make marks on different types of paper using found materials dip cardboard in paint and drag it across your paper, print circles with a bottle cap, use old brushes
- 2. Set aside to dry
- 3. Fold 7 A3 sheets of paper in half (to a4 size) and slot inside one another
- 4. On the inner folded line, mark a dot at 12cm and 17cm for your binding holes
- 5. Use a thick sewing needle to make a hole through all 7 sheets using your dots as guides
- 6. Set 6 sheets of your paper to one side and lay the last one flat on the table
- 7. On the right half (your front cover) use the mark making paper from earlier to form an interesting collage
- 8. Glue your collaged materials to the a3 paper
- 9. Once dry, fold your cover around the rest of your sketchbook
- 10. Thread your needle with sturdy thread, yarn or string do not knot
- 11. With your pages together and holes aligned, push your needle through the first hole, through all of your pages and out through the cover
- 12. Be careful not to pull the string completely through, leave enough to tie a knot on the inside
- 13. Thread back through the second hole and into the inside of your sketchbook
- 14. Thread through the first hole and back through the second again to make extra secure
- 15. Tie the ends of the string together on the inside of your sketchbook, pulling the thread tight
- 16. **For an easier alternative:** use a rubber band around the pages **or** wrap yarn around the spine and tie a secure knot on the outside of your sketchbook.
