

Rubbings and Paper Shapes

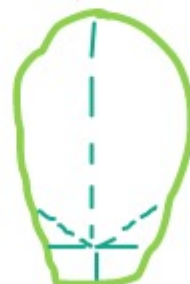
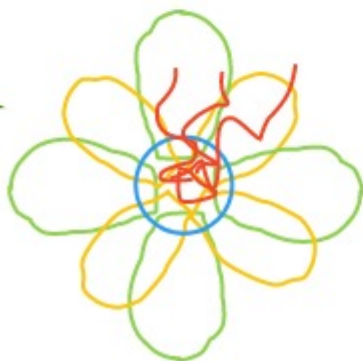
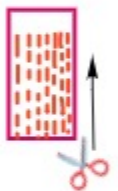
- You will need:
- Paper
 - A few fresh leaves
 - Crayons
 - Watercolours
 - Pen
 - Scissors
 - Glue stick

- Using fresh leaves, place them under your A4 paper and rub crayon over the top. It will leave a rubbing of the leaf on the page. Use multiple colours.
- Repeat on the other side of the page so both sides are covered in rubbings.
- Using watercolour paint, brush over the top of your wax rubbings. The wax of the crayon is waterproof and so the watercolour will only stain the white page.
- Leave to dry and repeat on the other side of the page.

- Draw and cut out 8 petal shapes on your wax/watercolour page (4 big and 4 small). You can use these as a guide:
- Also, draw and cut out a circle and rectangle.

- Fold petals in half lengthways, then fold the bottom up (1cm). Pinch in as shown in video.

- Using glue, stick bigger 4 onto circle
- Stick small 4 onto circle inside
- Stick the cut rectangle in to be like the filaments of a flower
