

DISCOVER TECHNOLOGY THROUGH PHOTOGRAPHY

STEM

Second Level P3-6 / £44 / 90 mins Maximum 30 pupils each session.

Science, technology and art collide in this exciting workshop. Pupils will investigate how domestic objects and the materials they are made of have developed over the years and record evidence using modern digital equipment to see for themselves how science and technology have changed their lives. HOW THE VULCAN FLOATS

The Vulcan at Summerlee was the first all-iron boat ever built, and at the time many doubted a boat made from iron could float. Pupils can visit the Vulcan and explore materials and buoyancy through practical experiment, to learn why the Vulcan floats. SCN 2-08b

SECONDARY SCHOOL VISITS TO SUMMERLEE MUSEUM

If you are studying history, then why not book a trip to Summerlee Museum of Scottish Industrial Life, Coatbridge. We have all the key elements for a fully immersive learning visit.

CHANGING LANARKSHIRE 1790-1900

Third / Fourth level S1-4 / £44 / 90 mins

Few places illustrate the changes brought by the Industrial Revolution better than Lanarkshire. Pupils will explore the impact of industrialisation on the county as it changed from a rural area of small villages and towns to the heartland of industrial Scotland, renowned throughout the world for its iron, coal, steel and bricks.

Pupils will use a selection of museum objects and archival sources to understand the living and working conditions of the miners and iron workers. Supports National 4 and 5 History unit Changing Britain 1790 -1900 but suitable for all secondary pupils. SOC 3-05b / SOC 4-05b

LANARKSHIRE'S GREAT WAR

Third / Fourth level S1-4 / £44 / 90 mins

The First World War had a significant impact on everyone in Lanarkshire, whether they fought abroad or stayed at home. In this new workshop pupils will use museum objects and archive materials to understand how the First World War impacted life at home in Lanarkshire. Pupils will research primary sources to discover how people in Lanarkshire were affected by the war, in their home and work life, to develop an understanding of the lasting social changes brought by the war. JOHN STEWART: LANARKSHIRE'S WAR POET

Third / Fourth level S1-4 £54 outreach / £44 at Summerlee / 45 mins

Funding from the Heritage Lottery
Fund has enabled museum staff to
uncover the story of John Stewart, a
local teacher who enlisted in the
Border Regiment for the First World
War. John was awarded the Military
Cross for bravery and published a
book of poetry, before being tragically
killed in battle in 1918. This workshop
covers his life and poetry and can be
delivered in school during a standard
lesson, or as an addition to our
Lanarkshire's Great War workshop at
Summerlee.




